The FAER Annual Meeting Resident Scholar Program provides \$1,000 educational grants to selected anesthesiology programs[†] to facilitate attendance of CA2 anesthesiology residents at the American Society of Anesthesiologists Annual Meeting.

Resident Scholars learn about new advances in anesthesiology, develop an understanding of the education, scientific and political issues facing anesthesiology practice and benefit from direct interaction with anesthesiology leadership and residents from other institutions.

- Register for the ASA Annual Meeting prior to June 30, 2009

- Attend the opening session⁺ of the ASA House of Delegates (Sunday, 9 AM)
- Attend the Celebration of Research (Monday, 12:30-2 PM)
- Attend the Ninth Annual FAER Honorary Research Lecture (Monday, 2-3 PM)
- Attend the FAER Resident Scholar/Medical Student Farewell Reception (Tuesday, 6:30-8:30 PM)
- Attend two of the following sessions:
 - The FAER Panel (Monday, 3-5 PM)
 - The FAER Academy of Research Mentors in Anesthesiology Workshop (Monday, 8-11 AM)
